<u>Purpose</u> - The purpose of the assignment is to show that you understand the dilemma of the Home Children and some of what they went through.


Information – Information on the Home Children can be obtained from the following sources.

This assignment must be broken into 5 parts.

- A) <u>Profile of your Child</u> You must include a profile on your imaginary child. The profile must contain the following information:
 - i. Name
 - ii. Country of Origin (where they came from)
 - iii. How they became a Home Child (they applied/ they were fooled / their parents sent them)
 - iv. Age when they came to Canada
 - v. Year when they came to Canada
 - vi. Type of work they did in Canada (Farm, household help, shop or factory
- B) <u>Life in the UK</u> describe the life of a Home Child when they were in the UK. This could include their family life, life on the street, life in the poor house or the orphanage. You may include any and all information you think is relevant.
- C) <u>The trip to Canada</u> describe the voyage to Canada. Include the time spent on a ship as well as the arrival in Halifax and the train ride out to Ontario. You could also include information on what the children were given as they left and the pleasant and unpleasant parts of the journey.
- D) <u>Early life in Canada</u> describe the type of placement a Home Child might receive. Whether they were treated well, abused or just neglected. Be sure to include the chores and jobs they had to do, the hours they had to work and general details about their new life both good and bad.
- E) <u>Later life in Canada</u> Describe the type of life a Home Child might have had when they were older and left the placement family. What type of education did they have and what type of jobs could they get. How would they treat their own children and what would be important for them as they grew older.

The idea is to tell the story of the child that you have created as they make the journey from an orphanage in the UK to a home placement in Canada. Use your imagination but make the story realistic given what you have learned about the British Home Children. The more detail and effort you show the higher your mark will be.
